



Famous for Fitting: Tuffer Sheep Cards

Fitting for the show ring, sheep men and women know, is best done with the help of Tuffer cards by Howard Brothers. Water won't warp Tuffer sheep cards, and they're otherwise practically indestructible. Here are their shapes and uses:

No. 1 — Straight tooth for "raking." As this is the first process, it is really equivalent to a good, rugged combing to get out all dirt and foreign matter.

No. 2 — Bent wire set properly for light, open fleeces such as Cheviots, some Oxfords, Tunis and some of the long wool breeds.

No. 3 — Bent wire set properly for dense fleeces such as Hampshires, Southdowns, Suffolks, Shropshires and Dorsets.

Note: In nearly every case there is a use for both Nos. 2 and 3 cards on the same sheep, as the wool varies on different parts of the body.

No. 4 — Small card for use around the head, ears and legs.

No. 5 — Small pocket card for touching up around the ears and legs when showing sheep.

No. 6 — Cleaning card with curved face for use in cleaning other cards.
